

Fort Selden Nov 1867

- 50 Apaches raided Fort Selden and took 13 Army horses and 30 mules
- · Colored soldier cavalry detachment pursued
- Running battle killed 3 Indians captured 8 Indian ponies
- Recaptured all stock except for 6 head that were killed in pursuit
- Soldiers accidently killed a Hispanic hay cutter



San Augustine Pass May 1869

- 2 May Apaches attacked a wagon train guarded by soldiers killing 2 and wounding 4
- Failed to capture wagons
- Soldiers reportedly killed 5 Indians and wounded 10
- 7 May three Cavalry were escorting a civilian thru pass.
- 40 Apaches attacked killing 2 of the Cavalry

Dog Canyon August 5, 1878



Dog Canyon August 5, 1878

- Cavalry was ordered to round up renegade Apache
- 52 Cavalry and 19 Navajo scouts headed for Guadalupe Mountains but found no Apache
- Returning found small party at mouth of Dog Canyon
- Skirmish killed three Apache and captured 22 horses

Dog Canyon August 5, 1878

- Up canyon more Apaches were found
- Indians fired on cavalry and rolled rocks down from the 800 foot cliffs
- The troopers attempted to climb the cliffs in the August heat.
- Several men suffered heatstroke
- At nightfall they reached the top but Apache were gone

Mescalero Agency Tularosa New Mexico 16 April 1880

- 700 men of 6th, 9th, and 10th Cavalry assembled to oversee surrender of 309 Apache
- Col Hatch intended to disarm the Apache
- Indian agent Samuel Russell warned Apache would not surrender if they were to disarm
- Army scouts killed two Indians that appeared to be raiding stock

Mescalero Agency Tularosa New Mexico 16 April 1880

- Indian agent Samuel Russell was irate
- Russell had authorized them to drive in the stray stock.
- Disarming the Apache caused a fight that killed 14 Indians. Apaches ran away.
- Most were rounded up, but 30 headed south

Dog Canyon 17 April 1880


- Apaches that fled found in Dog Canyon next day
- Maj Morrow men killed 3 Apaches and captured 20 horses
- Mescalero Apaches were confined to Indian Reservation ending the conflicts in the area.








ARRIVAL

- 14 Sep 1880 there is a Rochas no given name on manifest of SS St Laurent a commercial cargo ship.
 Sailed from Le Harve France
- The Loretto Chapel stained glass windows were made in France 1874 and shipped to New Mexico
- Stain glass window installed Nov 1877
- French sources believe the stairway was made in France and shipped to New Mexico for assembly.
- · Did Rochas return to France for the stairs?











Homestead

- Small water stream down canyon
- Rochas built rock fences to control cattle
- Tax records indicate he had 400 head of cattle


Oliver Lee

- In 1893 Oliver Lee started a large ranch next to Rochas.
- Oliver Lee over the years had multiple run ins with the law.
- Feb 1 1896 Colonel Fountain and son left La Luz.
 Passed the mail carrier in route but was never seen again.
- Two days later the buckboard spattered with blood was found 12 miles southeast. Oliver Lee was one suspect

Ambushed and Wounded

- In 1886 Rochas swore out a warrant for an employee Morrison for horse thief.
- · Morrison was arrested and released
- Morrison later ambushed Rochas working on his rock fence and wounded Rochas twice.
- Rochas reached his rock cabin and barred the door
- That night Morrison broke down the door and Rochas fired and wounded him. He escaped and was captured. Sent to Territorial Prison for 3 years
- · Rochas survived this incident.





Col Fountain Murder Case

- Traveled to Lincoln to press charges against Oliver Lee for unlawful rebranding cattle
- 32 indictments were issued
- Fountain told to drop charges or he would not reach home alive
- Murdered near White Sands
- · Bodies never found

Pat Garrett

- Attempted to arrest Oliver Lee
- Gun fire killed a deputy
- Oliver Lee would not surrender to Garrett
- Garrett had publicly threaten to kill Oliver
- Murder trial moved to Hillsboro NM
- Oliver Lee tried and acquitted.

History Detective Resolves Mystery

- Three letters found in Rochas cabin after his death had clues
- Written in French dated 23 Dec 1894
- One to a brother another to a sister
- A letter was to Quintos Monier the contractor that built Chapel in Sante Fe
- News of Rochas death noted in newspaper by Monier
- Jan 1895 newspaper article stated Rochas had built the spiral staircase
