This session will take you beyond the typical online resources. This discussion will be a four-pronged approach to research information to be found in state Archives, Historical Societies, Genealogical Societies, and Libraries.

DECONSTRUCTING YOUR FAMILY TREE: RE-EVALUATING THE "EVIDENCE

With so many online family trees that get cut and pasted into our own research, erroneous conclusions can sneak into our research uncontested. When information doesn't "add up," it's time to tear down the walls and rebuild anew and this is the topic of the third session.
