Be aware that these only cover certain years:

New York City Birth Records (1879-1909)

New York City Groom Index (1864-1937)

New York City Bride Index (1866-1937)

New York City Death Records (1862-1948)

After you find the event you want, and write down the names of the parties, the year and the certificate #, then you want to go to [SteveMorse.org](http://www.stevemorse.org) (it you're not already there)

At Steve Morse, you will then use his **FHL Film Numbers for New York City Records: Obtaining FHL Film Numbers for New York City Vital Records in One Step**

Or, you can go straight to [SteveMorse.org](http://www.stevemorse.org) and his site accesses the Italiangen indexes and his one-steps really are that now – he gives you the film # at Salt Lake.

From here you go to:

And after reading the instructions, you click on the “Photoduplication Request Form” and fill it in.

You send it electronically to the Family History Library in Salt Lake and in one or more weeks, they will e-mail you the certificate(s) you requested. They like you to limit yourself to 5 per month.
