### Tips for Reading Handwriting

- Make sure you understand the purpose of the record & information included.
- Learn the technical or special language used in that record type (religious, legal, etc.)
- If you can, work with high resolution digital images so you can enlarge them.
- Look at a wide range of examples of author's handwriting, not just your ancestor's record.
- Make notes on how s/he does lettering & compare illegible forms with letters you can read.
- Use references or helps specific to language.
- \*Be aware of your assumptions.\* Read slowly. Pay attention to details.

- Expect spelling inconsistencies (spelled phonetically; used abbreviations; mix of Latin & colloquial)
- & frequent use of abbreviations (sped up the recording process, saved paper, ...)



#### <u>Why</u>?

To help you read old German records.

#### Type in:

Surnames
Place Names
Common Words

What you get are eight choices of fonts to view.
